PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Kia ora e te whānau,



It's been a big week in the life of our school! Many of our tamariki have been involved in either Art Splash or the Futsal Festival or both, and of course we have also marked Te wiki o te Reo Māori (Māori Language Week).

This week te Kura o Tapu te Ranga took on the wero and engaged in a variety of rich and exciting learning activities to celebrate such a wonderful week. This has included; poi, rākau, waiata, new

kupu, mindfulness using pau te hau - pau te ha, games, and wonderful creations such as animations, stories and artworks. All of the learning spaces concluded the week with a hui to celebrate the mahi.

Teacher Only Day - 30 September 2022 Optional Whānau-Kaiako Connection (via Google Meet) 9-10.30am

Thank you to everyone who has taken part in our strategic planning consultation over the last couple of months. One of the things we heard from you as a parent and whānau community is that you really like student-led conferences, and appreciate the reporting, learning stories and learning snapshots as well as coffee connections.

However, we are aware that some would like an opportunity to ask teachers questions without your child present, particularly if the query doesn't feel quite significant enough to book a dedicated meeting.

To address this, we are trialling an **optional 5-minute booking (via Google Meet)** on our teacher only day where you can connect with your child's guardian group teacher (without your tamariki). Once you have booked a time, your child's teacher will send you a link for the time allocated.

The purpose of this session is to give you the opportunity to ask specific questions and clarify anything you have not been able to ask about your child after viewing their reporting or attending their student led conference (SLC).

For example:

- Does my child participate well in class?
- Is my child progressing as expected?
- What do they do well?
- What do they need help with?
- How do they get along with others?
- Are there any areas of concern socially or academically?
- Or if you have any other specific questions you wish to raise with your child's teacher before the commencement of Term 4.

If you think your questions may take longer than 5 minutes we ask you to make time in person for a longer conversation with your child's teacher.

COVID Update: the new long-term strategy

You'll be aware that on Monday 12 October, New Zealand moved to a new, long-term approach to COVID-19. These changes have been made based on public health advice and reflect high levels of immunity and declining case numbers across New Zealand.

This new approach will only result in minor changes to the way we operate as a kura.

Household contacts of a person with COVID do not need to isolate, but instead are asked to complete a RAT test each day, for 5 days. Therefore, tamariki who are household contacts but test negative and do not have COVID symptoms, should continue to attend our kura. It is the best place for them to be so they can be friends.

Support tamariki and kaiako who want to wear a mask while inside

Mask wearing is no longer required. However, as a kura, we will continue to:

- Support mask wearing for all when gathering in large groups Support any whānau who would like to wear masks onsite
- Ask students and staff in the medical room to wear masks
- We will continue to supply masks to learning spaces for both adults and tamariki.

All the other recommended public health measures will stay in place, as we know they reduce the spread of infectious and illnesses including COVID. These measures include ensuring our indoor spaces are well-ventilated, maintaining good hand

hygiene, encouraging everyone to cough or sneeze into elbows and, most importantly, staying home and getting tested if they have COVID symptoms.
